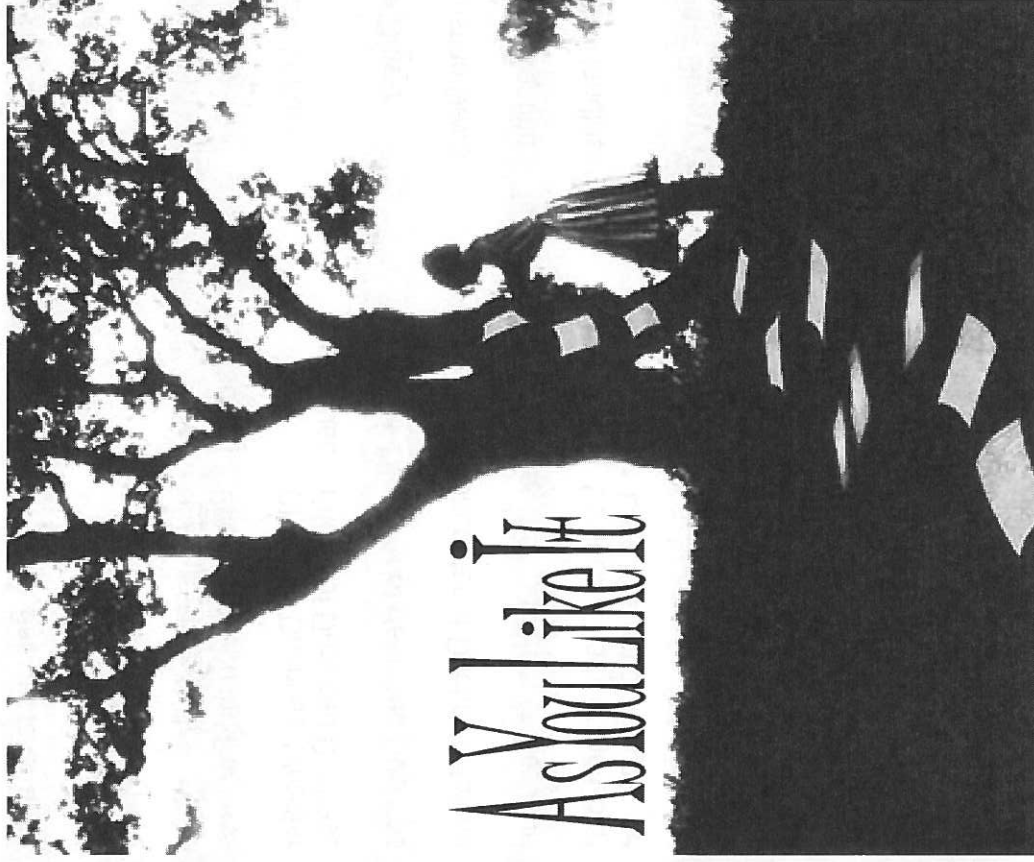

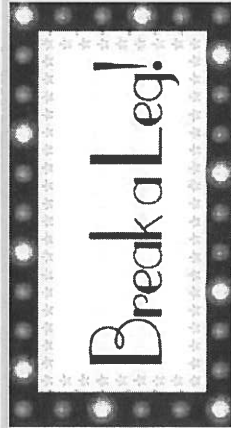
In the Forest of Arden

A brief overview...

As You Like It is a pastoral comedy by William Shakespeare believed to have been written in 1599 or early 1600 and first published in 1623. The work was based upon the novel *Rosalind*, by Thomas Lodge. The play's first performance is uncertain, though a performance at Wilton House in 1603 has been suggested as a possibility.

The play features one of Shakespeare's most famous and oft-quoted speeches, *All the world's a stage*, and is the origin of the phrase *too much of a good thing*. The play remains a favorite among audiences and has been adapted for radio, film, and musical theatre.

The plot is very simple: Rosalind, the daughter of a banished duke falls in love with Orlando the disinherited son of one of the duke's friends. When she is banished from the court by her usurping uncle, Duke Frederick, Rosalind switches genders and as Ganymede travels with her loyal cousin Celia and the jester Touchstone to the Forest of Arden, where her father and his friends live in exile. Observations on life and love follow (including love, aging, the natural world, and death) friends are made, and families are reunited. By the play's end Ganymede, once again Rosalind, marries her Orlando. Two other sets of lovers are also wed, including Celia and Orlando's mean older brother, Oliver. As Oliver becomes a gentler, kinder young man, so the Duke conveniently changes his ways and turns to religion and eventually the exiled Duke, father of Rosalind, rules once again.

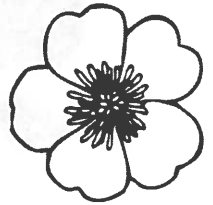
