Director's Notes

In the Fall of 2012 I was directing an Oregon Shakespeare Festival School Visit Presentation of William Shakespeare's *Henry the 5th*. In one particular afternoon rehearsal we were working on the scene where King Henry and his army attack Harfluer, a fairly intense part of the play containing the famous "Once More Unto the Breach" speech.

The rehearsal had reached a fever pitch and suddenly one of the actors decided to go into a scene from Monty Python and the Holy Grail. Needless to say, we were in stitches with laughter; a perfect break from the intensity of the rehearsal. Shortly afterwards and half joking, we thought, "Wouldn't it be great to insert some Monty Python into our presentation?" The first public presentation was a hilarious success! Shortly afterwards, I began to think about OCPA's Summer Classical Theater and how exciting something like this would be for the students of our program.

When I mentioned my idea of combining the stories of Shakespeare's *Henry the Fifth* and *Monty Python and the Holy Grail* to friends and fellow theater artists, everyone became as excited as I was about the project. I have to say the best was meeting the husband of a college friend who was a member of the college comedy troupe that consisted of the original members of the Monty Python! He thought it was right in line with the Python aesthetic.

I continue to find ways in which these two plays work together and, the best of all, how our company is helping to further refine and focus the two scripts. They are the final variable in making this theatrical equation fun, exciting, surprising, beautiful, stirring and impressive!






Zach Sutton is a freshman at St. Mary's and
